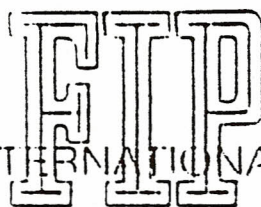
Success is of course dependent on Commission members playing their part fully by responding to requests for information and ensuring news of the activities of the Commission is widely distributed among the members of their National Federations.

REPORT TO SIXTY-FIRST FIP CONGRESS IN GRANADA 4 MAY 1992

As there has only been a short period of time between this Congress and the previous one in Tokyo, out of necessity the report on the activities of the Postal Stationery Commission will be brief.

At the Commission meeting held on the 3rd May 1992 here in Granada, Delegates from 20 countries were present in person together with a number of Observers. Mr. Knud Mohr was in attendance as the representative of the FIP Board. The following persons were elected:-

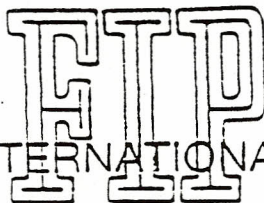
Details were given of the following projects:-

1. Compilation of information on philatelic organisations concerned with the field of postal stationery; details of magazines and catalogues dealing with postal stationery.
2. The outline plan of a booklet entitled 'Introducing Postal Stationery'.
3. The preparation of visual material to assist those wishing to prepare postal stationery exhibits for competition and/or display.

Various items of news concerning the production of new types of postal stationery were then presented and agreement was reached to hold the next meeting of the Commission during Bangkok'93.

At the conclusion of the Commission meeting a Bureau meeting took place, responsibility for future actions distributed between the Bureau members and Salih M Kuyas was elected Vice-President of the Commission.

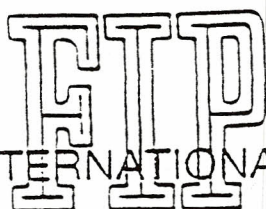

Revision of GREV, SREV and Guidelines for evaluation of stationery.

At the Congress in Granada certain changes to the GREV, and the SREV and Guidelines for evaluation of postal stationery were made:

The changes for the GREV (and SREV) will be printed, and submitted by FIP to the member Federations.

Changes for the SREV Postal Stationery are:

Article 1.

First line: Article 1.5 has to be changed to: Article 1.4

Continued..../

Article 5.

5.1 3rd line, (Articles 31-47) has to be changed to (Articles 3.1 - 4.7)

5.2: 1) the number of points changes from 35 to 30

5.2: 2) the text has to be changed to: Philatelic and Related Knowledge, Personal Study and Research

5.2: 3) the number of points changes from 25 to 30

Article 6.

6.2. 54th FIP Congress on 5th November 1985 in Rome, is changed to:
61st FIP Congress on 4th May 1992 in Granada

They come into force on 4th May 1992

Bottom line: 54th is changed to 61st

The changes for the Guidelines are the same as written above. With the next Newsletter you will get an updated copy of the Guidelines, which have to be formally approved in Bangkok 1993. An updated version of the SREV will be printed and submitted by FIP to the member Federations.
