Message from the President.

During 1999 Commission activities have primarily involved vere successfull seminars held in Melbourne and Paris as part of AUSTRALIA 99 and PHILEXFRANCE 99, and more detailed accounts of these can be found elsewhere in the Newsletter.

In addition I was invited to give displays to the Royal Philatelic Society of Victoria during my stay in Melbourne for AUSTRALIA 99 and contribute a non-competitive exhibit to provide an introduction to the postal stationery class in the exhibition itself.

A further opportunity to promote interest in postal stationery internationally resulted from an invitation to visit Helsinki as the guest of the Helsingfors Frimærkssamlere Forening.

CHINA 99 and BULGARIA 99 also had postal stationery classes and the results for these exhibitions as well for AUSTRALIA 99 and PHILEXFRANCE are listed in this Newsletter.

Looking forward to thsi year there are STAMP SHOW 2000, WIPA 2000, INDONESIA 2000 and ESPANA 2000 which will doubtless attract strong entries of postal stationery exhibits. The FIP Congress is beeing held in Madrid during ESPANA 2000 and this will be preceded by a meeting of the Commission. The data has not yet been finalised, but is likely to be in the period 11 - 13 October and details will be forwarded to you later.

Nominations for Commission President and Bureau members have to be made by 14 May 2000 at the latest and separate papers for this are enclosed with this Newsletter. You will also find information regarding the proposals from the FIP Board for the revision of the Statutes and GREX and your attention is directed to these some of which will have significant effect of Commission organisation, if accepted.

At STAMP SHOW 2000 arrangements have been made to have a joint meeting with The Postal Stationery Society on Sunday 28 May at 10.30 am to 1.30 pm at Earls Court and any delegate present in London are invited to attend. The meeting programme comprises an introductory talk by myself and displays by Paul Jensen from Norway and by Jan Stolk from the Netherlands. The meeting will take place in the Wellington Room 21.

In conclusion I wish everyone a healthy, happy and peaceful 2000.

Changes to FIP Statutes, GREX and GREV proposed by the FIP Board.

It must be emphasised that at present the changes are only proposals and would need the agreement of Congress prior to their implementation. From the Commission point of view there are several significant matters that need to be considered. These include:

1. The proposal to change the size and method of election of the President and Bureau (Article 42 replacing Article 37 of the statutes).
2. The proposal to simplify the levels of medals awarded to competitive exhibits at FIP exhibitions (GREV Article 5.5 replacing Article 5.4)
3. The proposal to give "Promotional" Members voting rights in the Congress and to appoint Delegates to Commissions (Article 9 and 41 replacing Articles 10A and 36 of Statutes)

1. Article 40 Philatelic Commissions and sections.(proposed revision).

40.1 The Philatelic Commissions and sections (hereafter referred to as "Commissions" are technical committees of FIP

40.2 They work in compliance with the guidelines for duties for the Philatelic Commissions of the FIP

2. Article 41 Membership of Commissions (proposed revision).

41.1 Every Member and Promotional Member may appoint a delegate to every FIP-Commission.

2. Article 42 Commission Bureau (proposed revision).

42.1 The Commission Bureau shall comprise a Chairman, Secretary and ordinary members one representing each an associate member.

42.2 Membership of the Bureau shall be restricted to the Delegates of the Commission

42.3 The Chairman and Secretary shall be elected by vote of all delegates

42.4 The remaining places on the Bureau shall be elected from each associate member in turn. Only those candidates representing a member country of the associate member shall be elected to represent such associate member. All delegates have the right to vote.

42.5 The FIP Board shall submit the nomination of each Chairman of the Commissions to the Congress for confirmation for a term of four years. Commission Chairman, Secretaries and Bureau members may not serve for more than two consecutive terms in the same position and four terms in total.

42.6 No person may at one and the same time, hold office as Bureau Member of more than one Commission.

42.7 The President of a Continental Federation may not be nominated as Bureau member or for election as Chairman or Secretary.

42.8 The FIP Board shall nominate one of its members to co-ordinate the activities of each Commission and to attend that Bureau's and Commissions meetings.

Article 37 (Existing article).

37.1 Each Commission shall elect a working Committee (hereafter referred to as the "Bureau") from among its own delegates comprising the President and not more than 6 other members.

37.2 The FIP Board shall submit the nomination of each President of the Commission to the Congress for confirmation for a term of four years. Commission Presidents may serve for two consecutive terms.

37.3. No person may, at one and same time, hold office as President of more than one Commission

5.5. Medals will be awarded as per the following table, based on the total of the assessments under the headings in 5.2. above obtained by the exhibit

Article 9 Promotional Membership (Proposed revision).

- 9.1 The Postal Organisations of countries, where there are no national federations or philatelic organisations may be admitted as a Promotional Member.
- 9.2 As soon as a National Federation is formed they shall reply for full membership at the next appropriate Congress and, the Promotional Member shall step down after acceptance of the National Federation.
- 9.3 The Promotional Member has a right to vote in the Congress.

Article 10A Promotional Membership (Existing article).

- 10A.1 The Postal Organisations of countries where there are no national federations or philatelic organisations, may be admitted as a Promotional member. As soon as a National Federation or a proper Philatelic Organisation is formed, the Promotional Member shall be replaced by such National Federation or Philatelic Organisation who shall apply for full membership at the next appropriate Congress. The Promotional Member has no right to vote in the Congress.
- 10A.2 Applications for Promotional Membership must be accompanied by:
- Details of the Philatelic services provided in their country
 - Plan for promotion of philately in their country
 - An undertaking that formation of a national Philatelic Body the promotional Member will sponsor their body's application to become FIP Member
 - A declaration to accept without qualification all FIP Statutes and regulations.

- 36.1 Every FIP Member may appoint a delegate to every FIP Commission

Book review: "May dates - a survey of Penny Blacks, Twopennys Blues, Mulreadys and Caricatures used during May 1840". Mike Jackson FRPSL: ISBN 0-9528274-1-7, 334pp, Published by Mike Jackson Publications, 3 Cottesmore Avenue, Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire LE15 OHY (1999).

As stated in the title this work is a survey of all the surviving recorded covers bearing adhesive stamps and the Mulready postal stationery which were used during May 1840. This book provides a ground-breaking archive of information which will be of lasting use to all students of this period.

From the postal stationery perspective all the documented examples of usages of 1 d Mulready envelopes and letter-sheets between May 6 and 30 May 1840, are listed and in many cases illustrated. The listings are arranged in ascending order of stereo number (where known) and give the location of posting and destination and the source of information including auction lot numbers, estimated value and prices realised. Descriptions are also included if relevant to condition and postal markings. Separate sections cover Mulreadys uprated with adhesive stamps and Mulready Caricatures and there is an Appendix of contemporary comments.

There is no doubt that Mike Jackson has to be congratulated on producing a work of great value and which should be in the library of everyone with an interest in GB philately of this period.

Book review: Danmarks Højsager - Oluf Pedersen & Jan Bendix. ISBN 87-87832-58-5 (1999). Published by Skilling Printing House, Nyvej 17, DK 4050 Skibby. E-mail skilling@skilling.dk 320 pp. DKR 325.00

The last edition of this catalogue came in 1986. This new edition now incorporates the private postal stationery of Denmark printed by the postal authorities. It is a general catalogue comprising postcards, double postcard, envelopes, lettercards, wrappers and aerogrammes, including service postal stationery issued by the Danish Postal Authorities.

The prices have been revised by a group of Philatelic dealers, Auction Houses and collectors, and for some items the prices are raised remarkably

Besides the catalogisation of all issued postal stationery in Denmark, the catalogue contains a lot of extra information about rates, usages, printing methods, perforations and cut outs etc, and it also has a lot of illustrations of scarce items.

A must for every collector of Danish postal stationery

Book review: Cyprus Postal Stationery 1878 - 2000. Alexander C Ionnides & Christopher J Podger. Second Edition, ISBN 096-385547-1-2 (2000). Published by the authors. 258 pp. £ 45.

This new edition incorporates a number of additions and improvements and now gives a truly superb treatment of the subject, which has been greatly enhanced by the inclusion of a significant number of coloured illustrations. The usage of British Postal Stationery in the period 1878 - 80 is now documented and reveals the true variety of these forerunners to the time overprinted for use in Cyprus, which are themselves of considerable variety in used condition.

Naturally a considerable amount of additional information has emerged since the publication of the first edition and this has been integrated into the appropriate sections, necessitating the rearrangement of the numbering system. A table of postal rates for the British period is now included and the authors have provided additional chapters on both the history and the postal history of Cyprus giving a broader perspective to the origins and usage of the items described.

This book will doubtless generate even greater interest in the postal stationery of Cyprus and the authors are to be congratulated for producing such a valuable source of reference and enjoyment for their fellow collectors.
