Message from the President.

It seems amazing that a year has passed since the previous Newsletter but whichever school of thought you subscribe to, the 21st century has now well and truly started and I wish everyone well for 2001.

A major development for communication between the Commission and the global population of collectors has been the launch of our own web-site with the Internet address www.postal stationery.org. This has come about, following discussion at the Madrid Commission meeting, through the dedicated work put in by Ross Towle of the USA, and we all owe him a considerable debt of gratitude for creating the structure and content which is an excellent shop-window for postal stationery collecting and the activities of the Commission - se seperate note in this Newsletter.

As ever Commission activities have focused on events aimed at promoting the collecting, exhibiting and judging of postal stationery. Apart from Regional and National presentations by various members of the Commission a joint meeting with the Postal Stationery Society was held during THE STAMP SHOW 2000 on May 28 and was most successfull being attended by over 50 people.

The other major gathering of the Commission during 2000 was held just before the 66th FIP Congress in Madrid on 13th October. A full account can be found elsewhere in this Newsletter but it is worth noting that membership of the Commission has now risen to 63 and I would like to extend a warm welcome to the following Federations - Emirates, Hong Kong, Latvia, Pakistan, Paraguay and Slovenia.

More recently in early February I visited Berlin to go to BEPHILA 2001, a German Regional exhibition which also celebrated the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Berliner Ganzsachen Sammler Verein which appears to be the oldest specialised philatelic society in the world - a remarkable achievement of which they can be justifiably proud. Is was a great pleasure to meet many fellow postal stationery enthusiasts at this exhibition and on behalf of the Commission Hans-Georg Meissner and I gave a presentation on "The Evolution of British Postal Stationery to 1900". An open meeting of the Commission is being arranged by Luc van Tichelen on the 15th June during BELGICA 2001 which will feature several short displays and talks. A further meeting of the Commission will take place just before the 67th FIP Congress in Seoul - details to be announced later.

Finally I should like to warmly thank all those who have assisted with the work of the Commission and those Federations which provide resources to fund its activities.

Report to Madrid FIP Congress.

In my report to the 65th Congress in Milan in 1998 I indicated a progressive increase in interest in both the collecting and exhibiting of postal stationery. This trend has continued and a particular feature has been the enhanced recognition accorded by both traditional and thematic collectors, as well as postal historicans, of the significant contribution that postal stationery can make to their own areas of philately.

The activities of the Commission have focused on events designed to stimulate interest in the collecting, exhibiting and the judging of postal stationery and these have taken place at AUSTRALIA 99, PHILEXFRANCE 99 and THE STAMP SHOW 2000. In addition to these many members of the Commission have promoted postal stationery via regional, and or national presentations or through societies.

The Commission Newsletter continues to keep the 57 member Federations informed of new publications, exhibition awards etc, and I would once again like to thank Erik Hvidberg Hansen for his dedicated worh as editor.

I am also pleased to to report that the number of FIP accredited jurors and team leaders has grown while new exhibits continue to appear and others progressively improve their level of award. The literature also continues to expand and new works are reviewed and brought to the attention of members via the newsletter. The proposals made by the FIP Board for changes to the regulations for Commissions and awards have allready been circulated and will be further considered at the Commission meeting on the 13th October in Madrid.

Finally I should like to express my sincere appreciation to all those who have assisted the work of the Commission and to thank those Federations who continue to provide financial resources to fund its activities thus avoiding the need to call on central FIP sources.

The following Federations nominated Delegates but were not present at the meeting: China, Costa Rica, Emirates, Hungary, Hong Kong, Latvia, Luxembourg, Pakistan, Singapore, Slovenie and Thailand (also nominated proxy for Japan)

The Observers present were: FIP Patrick Pearson, Australia Malcolm Groom and Jojn Sinfield, USA Ross Towle.

Bolivia nominated Uruguay as proxy.

Total voting Members present 25 + 1 proxy

2. Approval of the Minutes of the Milan meeting.

The Minutes of the meeting held in Milan on 30 october 1998 (circulated in the January 1999 Newsletter) were approved.

3. Report to the FIP Board for the Madrid Congress.

The Report to the FIP Board (dated July 2000) for the Madrid Congress was noted and approved.

4. Membership of the Commission.

The following requests for membership of the Commission have been recieved from federations: Emirates, Hong Kong, Latvia, Pakistan, Paraguay and Slovenia.

The following changes to Delegates to the commission have been recieved from Federations: Armenia - Samvel Ohanian, Chile - Martin Urrutia.

5. Proposals of the FIP Board for changes to the FIP Statutes and Regulations.

The proposals (previously circulated and discussed with the members of the Bureau and federations) of the Fip Board were further discussed as follows:

- A. That from 2004 (or earlier if the Commission wishes) Commission Bureaux would comprise a Chairman, a Secretary and 3 members each representing one Associate member of FIP (Continental Federations).
- B. That medal levels awarded at FIP Exhibitions be reduced to Gold, Silver and Bronze.
- C. That Promotional Members of FIP be entitled to vote.

Noted that FIP Board had decided to shelve proposals B and C

With regard to A the Commission confirmed that the Structure of the Bureau be 6, being drawn equally from the 3 Continental Federations, with the Chairman and Secretary being elected from within the Bureau.

6. Commission SREV and Guidelines.

The following amendment to the Postal Stationery SREV was proposed and accepted: SREV 3.2 Insert "5. Local Post Issues" to bring the Srev into lines with the Guidelines.

The problem of unstamped items which do not come within the category of "Formula" items was discussed. Noted that:-

- i) These may or may not be similar to normal stamped postal stationery
- ii) There was a problem with many modern plastic items, boxes etc.
- iii) Telegraph stamps and forms were not accepted by the revenue Commission. This can result in problems with unstamped forms if they are included in exhibits submitted in the postal stationer class.
- iv) International Reply Coupons have not been included under postal stationery SREV 3.4 since they do not bear stamp impressions but have from time to time been accepted as within the class for judging purposes.

Agreed not to amend Guidelines at present but keep the situation under review.

7. Election of President and Bureau.

The following proposals were put forward by the FIP Observer, Patrick Pearson, for President of the Commission and 6 Bureau Members:

President: Alan K Huggins

Bureau: Erik Hvidberg Hansen (Denmark); Alexander Ilyushin (Russia); Cesar Jones (Uruguay); Hans-Georg Meissner (Germany); Stephen D Schumann (USA); and Raymond Todd (Australia);

The proposals were unanimousely accepted by the Commission.

The President thanked the Commission for their continuoued support and confidence, welcomed Alexander Ilyushin as new member of the Bureau, and paid testemony to the long standing contribution of the retiring Vice-President Salih Kuyas to the work of the Commission.

NB! At the meeting of the Bureau which followed the Commission meeting Raymond Todd (Australia) was elected Vice-President, and Erik Hvidberg Hansen (Denmark) was elected Secretary.

8. Accredited Team Leaders and Jurors.

A list of Accredited Team Leaders and Jurors was distributed at the meeting and an updated version is published with these Minutes.

9. Future events. It was agreed to hold Commission Meetings at BELGICA 2001 and PHILAKOREA 2001. The attention of members was drawn to the fact that the Berliner Ganzsachen Sammler Verein would celebrate its 100th Anniversary in February 2001 and that postal stationery would be featured at BEPHILA 2001, a regional exhibition wich was to be held in Berlin from February 8 - 11 2001.

The Fourth Swiss Special Exhibition for Postal Stationery, GABRA IV, will take place from 23 - 25 September in Burgdorf.

10 WEB site.

The need to create a Web-site for the Commission was discussed and it was agreed to accept the offer of Ross Towle to co-ordinate information and produce a trial site. Alexander Ilyushin suggested a bibliography be produced and placed on the site. Suggestions for other material to be sent to Ross Towle (See addresses in "The Secretarys corner").

11. Training materials.

The STAMP SHOW 2000 featured a Collectors Information Centre which included displays designed to introduce a variety of collecting disciplines and photocopies of the postal stationery section were distributed to those present at the meeting.

Stephen Shumann and Raymond Todd gave a seminar at the Providence, Rhode Island STAMPSHOW 2000 on 26 august and distributed a paper by Ray on "Postal Stationery, Some Collecting, Exhibiting and Judging Observations".

12. Other Business.

Luc van Tichelen (Belgium) requested advice on two points:-

Must aerogrammes always be displayed in the Areophilatelic class? Answer they can be displayed in the Postal Stationer class as well.

May "Coupons response International" be displayed in the Postal Stationery Class? Answe yes but are likely to be considered rather limited in importance if evaluated competitively.

Book reviews.

PAKISTAN OVERPRINTS 1947-49, by Mohd.Arif Balgamwala, First edition May 2000;175pp. Published by the Author, C-16 Akber Apartments, Bleak House Road, Karachi 7, Pakistan. Fax 5675494. e-mail: Error! Bookmark not defined.

This well produced book present a most comprehensive account and listing of the overprints applied to adhesive stamps and postal stationery both by the Indian Security Press at Nasik, and by various towns in Pakistan, Of the books 175 pages nearly 60 are devoted to postal stationery, while 15 pages are used to give an index of overprints by size to facilitate finding the location where the overprint was applied. A price guide ia also included. The author is to be congratulated on bringing the information together and presenting it for the benefit of other collectors.

POSTAL STATIONERY OF PAKISTAN 1947 - 1995 by F.Aleem Sundal & Rafiq Kasbati. December 1995, 148 pp. Published by the Authors, Karachi, Pakistan.

Although published over five years ago this work has only just come to hand and I thought it appropriate to bring it to the attention of Commission Members since it covers the subsequent issues to those listed by Balgamwala. Every item is illustrated and the text is clear and easy to follow. A guide to values is also included and the listing will be extremely useful to all those interested in the postal stationery of Pakistan.

ADVERTISING RINGS by Richard Arundel, 2000. 40pp. Published by Richard Arundel Ltd. Publications, POBox 22, Woking, GU24 9 SN

This spiral-bound booklet provides a basic listing of the British Companies which either uthe possibility of having additional advertising rings printed at the same time as they had their stationery stamped at Somerset House, or had rings added privately afterwards. Whilst this publication will be a useful aid to collectors especially new onens, it unfortunately does not give the full range of information which has been published but tends to record what the author has seen, a not uncommon situation in philatelic publications. An attempt has been made to provide a guide to value and an alphabetical index of companies is also included
